The Springville City Council met in regular session October 17, 2022.

Discussion was held on the proposed changes to the code pertaining to golf carts. This went back to P & Z after the last council meeting. Council would like to remove the requirement for permitting golf carts. P & Z reviewed, and the commission recommends keeping the permitting and keep the fee at \$20. Council discussed and the majority felt like it was unnecessary to continue to permit golf carts. The changes will be drafted and brought back.

Mayor Andersen presented council with a packet of employee review forms. He would like council to review the performance of each employee if they have had any interaction with the employee. The forms have changed and gone away from the number system. Mayor would like their review forms back November 7. Mayor will be giving the employees their self-review forms soon. He would like to hold all reviews in December.

Mayor presented council with a rough draft of council code of conduct and meeting rules. He would like feedback on this draft over the next couple of months so they can adopt it before January 1.

The next regular council meeting will be Monday, November 7, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall.

There being no further discussion, Barner moved to adjourn at 6:53 p.m., seconded by Baych. All ayes. Motion carried.
