Mayor Andersen chose to discuss topic 12 & 13 together. Discussion was held about the school traffic control. Baych reported that the school was going to stop using the temporary signs as it is not good for the school's liability. The City would like to find a suitable answer for the traffic control in school areas. Baych had a section from the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. It suggests having designated school routes with sidewalks and clearly defined crosswalks. They will be looking at the route of the kids currently and see how the sidewalk conditions are. This will take some time to define what areas will be in the designated school route, so Mayor Andersen asked Baych and Merritt to be on a committee to gather the information and bring it back to council for action.

Council also discussed making 1st Ave & 6th Street a permanent 3-way stop. Baych made a motion to approve Resolution 51-2022, to set a public hearing for Monday, October 17th at 6:00 pm, seconded by Barner. RCV: AYES: Barner, Baych, Blakely, Merritt, Kilburg. NAYS: None. **RESOLUTION 51-2022 adopted.**

Discussion was held on the proposed changes to the code pertaining to golf carts. Planning & Zoning has reviewed and made a recommendation for council to approve the changes. Merritt proposed that the City stop requiring golf carts to be permitted. This would remove the task of chasing residents who do not get their carts registered in a timely manner. The City brings in approximately \$1,500 from the golf cart permits. Wagaman will make the requested changes and bring back to council to review and set a public hearing.

Discussion was held on the proposed changes to the code pertaining to ATV/UTVs. Planning & Zoning has reviewed and made a recommendation for council to approve the changes. Blakely made a motion to approve Resolution 49-2022, to set a public hearing on October 17, 2022, at 6:00 p.m., to amend Chapter 75 of the Springville Code of Ordinances pertaining to ATV/UTVs, seconded by Kilburg. RCV: AYES: Barner, Baych, Blakely, Merritt, Kilburg. NAYS: None. **RESOLUTION 49-2022 adopted.**

Discussion from Baych and Barner, that the construction committee for Emmons Park decided to leave the eastern loop natural. They are recommending approving the low bid from Maple Valley Tree Service in the amount of \$16,000. Baych made a motion to approve Resolution 50-2022, to award the contract to remove trees for the east loop to Maple Valley Tree Service, seconded by Barner, RCV: AYES: Kilburg, Baych, Merritt, Barner, Blakely. NAYS: None. **RESOLUTION 50-2022 adopted.**

The next regular council meeting will be Monday, October 17, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall.

There being no further discussion, Blakely moved to adjourn at 7:29 p.m., seconded by Barner. All ayes. Motion carried.
