DO YOU REMEMBER WHEN...

Two Cherry families near Springville in 1860s, 1880s

The talent-deprived Cherry Sisters lived near Marion during their career, but four of them spent part of their childhood not far from Springville. Thomas and Laura Rawson Cherry were born in Rhode Island and Vermont. They and their first child, Ellen (Ella) moved to Franklin Township, Linn County, Iowa, before the 1856 census.

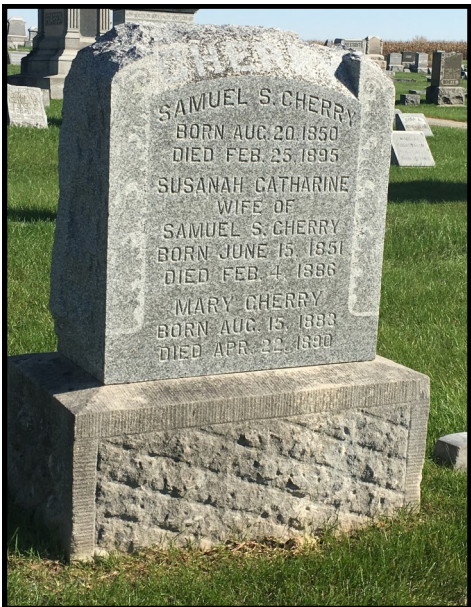
In March 1862, Thomas Cherry bought land about 5 miles south of Springville from Robert and Rhoda Boxwell. The 9-acre parcel was south of Dee Lane in Section 16 of Linn Township. The parents moved there from Mount Vernon with Ella, 7; Lizzie, 5; and Addie, 3.

Nathan, Inez, Effie, and possibly Anna Cherry were born in Linn Township. The family moved to rural Cedar Rapids before the 1870 census, and later to rural Marion. Jessie was born about 1872. Neither Inez nor Anna lived to adulthood. The mother died in 1875, the father in 1888. As a teenager, Nathan left – permanently.

On Jan. 23, 1893, Addie, Effie, and Jessie made their stage debut at Daniels Opera House in Marion. They became touring entertainers described as “so bad they were good.” Lizzie performed for a short time; Ella stayed home. None of the five married.

A Springville physician, Dr. Clarence Darrow, cared for Lizzie Cherry during her final illness. About 79, she died at St. Luke’s Hospital May 11, 1936. Springville’s Methodist minister, the Rev. Lamont C. Smith, conducted her funeral at Yocom Funeral Chapel in Marion. The last sister, Effie, died Aug. 5, 1944.

ANOTHER CHERRY COUPLE, probably unrelated, lived near Springville in the early 1880s. Samuel S. Cherry was born in Blair County, Pa., in 1850. A farmer, he came to Iowa and married Susanah Catharine (Cassie) Brown March 9, 1882, in Linn County.

Their daughter Mary was born in March 1883 at Springville. The family moved before the 1885 census to Woodbine, in far western Iowa. A son, Samuel Thomas (called Thomas), was born Jan. 26, 1886. Nine days later, Cassie died at 34. She was buried in the Springville Cemetery.

In April 1890, little Mary Cherry, 7, was interred at Springville. Cause of her death is unknown. The 1895 Harrison County census listed Samuel, age 44; his second wife, Mary A., 41; son Thomas, 9; and daughter Opal, 1. Samuel died Feb. 23, 1895, two days after a tree fell on him. Then there were three Cherry graves at Springville.

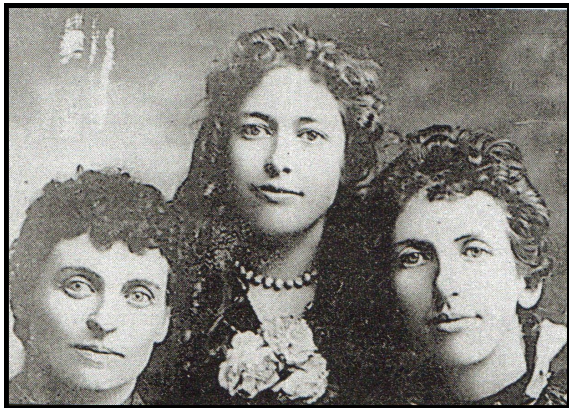
Thomas grew up and married Blanche McGowan from Fairview Oct. 24, 1906. Their first child lived one day; the marker in Springville Cemetery reads only “Baby Cherry.” Three daughters, Lucille, Opal, and Dorothy, arrived later. The family lived in Marion.

Thomas Cherry died Oct. 10, 1967, and his wife two years later. They are interred at Cedar Memorial in Cedar Rapids. Three of the Cherry Sisters (including Jessie, who died in 1903 at Hot Springs, Ark.) are interred at Murdoch-Linwood Cemetery, Cedar Rapids. The burial place of Ella, Lizzie, and their parents is Oak Shade Cemetery, Marion. Inez and Anna’s grave sites are unknown.

Historical Society will meet Dec. 12 for holiday social

Springville Area Historical Society (SAHS) will meet at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 12, in the SAHS building beside City Hall. A Christmas social time will follow a brief business meeting. Members and interested non-members are welcome.

At the Nov. 14 meeting, Bev Franks discussed plans for restoring the 132-year-old Nathan Brown monument in the town cemetery. Individuals and groups may make tax-deductible donations to the Nathan Brown Monument fund now open at the Exchange State Bank.

SAHS members voted to donate \$500 to the fund. Several historical grants will be sought. Cost of the project is nearly \$34,000. SAHS president James Crow is on the monument restoration committee.

Nathan Brown, a Revolutionary War veteran, was born in New York state. He came to Springville from Geneva, Ill., in May 1839 with his second wife, Tamar, and children Harriet, Amanda, and Horace. Nathan, 80, died in November 1842.

SAHS historian Karen Taylor reported on John Chapman Brown, son of Nathan and his first wife. John was born in 1787; lived in Onondaga County, N. Y.; died in 1847; and is buried in Syracuse, N. Y.

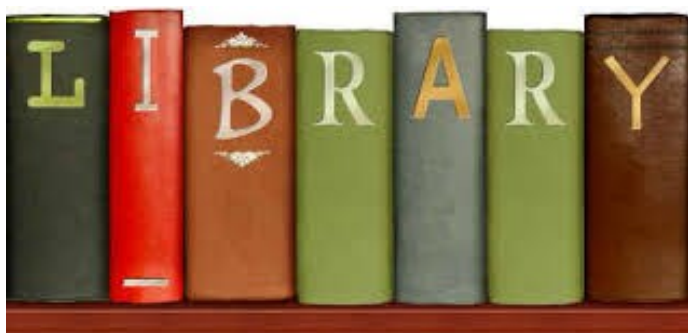
Wes Bender, vice president, showed a certificate from the Sullivan Brothers Iowa Veterans Museum, Waterloo. It memorializes Robert L. Newman of Springville, who died in the Korean War. Sandra Soper Anderson of Cedar Rapids, Newman’s next of kin, will receive it.

A 1958 calendar with a photo of the Springville Co-Op Elevator was brought to SAHS by Jean Schmidt, secretary-treasurer, on behalf of the donor, Pat Rose. A long-time Springville resident, Pat now lives in Marion.

SAHS welcomed guest Dave Deutsch, who recently moved to Springville. Others attending Nov. 14 were Rick Heeren; Dave and Eleanor Kelley; and Phil and Karen Randall.

ONE PERSON INTERRED in the Nathan Brown family lot at the Springville Cemetery was not a family member. He was Patrick Killen (1830-1914), born in County Galway, Ireland. An old family retainer, he worked for Horace and Julia Brown, and Julia’s relatives, for almost 50 years. Killen was a Civil War veteran of the Sixth Iowa Cavalry.

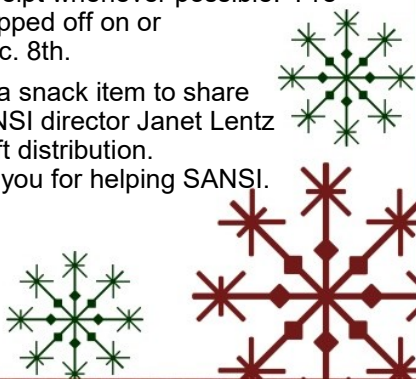
