Springville licenses the use of golf carts. These vehicles must have a slow-moving vehicle sign and a safety flag at least 5 feet high. A permit will be issued when the required \$25.00 payment, & proof of insurance has been received in good order.

Owners can log into their Front Desk Accounts to complete the form & attach proof of insurance then make payment after registration has been approved. Payments can also be made at the City Clerk's office.






FLAG RETIREMENT CEREMONY






The Springville City Council met in regular session April 4, 2022.

Pledge of allegiance was recited.

Mayor Andersen called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. Council members present: Karla Blakely, Brad Merritt, Jeff Baych, Cindy Kilburg, and Bart Barner. City staff present: Public Works Director Todd Wyman and City Clerk Dee Wagaman. Mike Swayze, Sonja Spicer, Leisa Breitfelder, and Treva Davis were also present.

Blakely made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Kilburg. All ayes. Motion carried.

Barner made a motion to approve the following consent agenda items: Approval of March 21, 2022, meeting minutes and approval of bills, seconded by Merritt. All ayes. Motion carried.

Linn County Sheriff's report presented.

Library report presented.

Engineer's report included in packet.

Public Works report included in packet.

Clerk report included in packet.

Mayor Andersen reported that he is continuing to work on the CO2 pipeline.

Council member, Barner gave a report on the construction at Emmons Park. Commented that the GALA was a huge success and will let the Park Board report on that.

Mayor invited citizens with input to speak. There being no public comments, Mayor Andersen moved to business.

Mayor Andersen welcomed Mike Swayze and allowed the council to discuss Swayze's proposal to allow honeybees in the community. Andersen took a vote to move forward with the process to allow honeybees in the community. Merritt-Nay, Blakely-Aye, Baych-Nay, Kilburg-Aye, Barner-Nay. Council will not move forward with developing an Ordinance to allow honeybees.

Barner made a motion to hire Shive Hattery to work on a utility easement with Daryl Pearson, seconded by Merritt. All ayes. Motion carried.

Blakley made a motion to approve pay app #2 from Maple Valley Tree Service in the amount of \$67,020, seconded by Kilburg. All ayes. Motion carried.

Barner made a motion to approve the NRCS closeout documents for the Big Creek Debris Removal Project, seconded by Merritt. All ayes. Motion carried.

Kilburg made a motion to approve Resolution 17-2022 to purchase a 2014 John Deere Tractor in the amount of \$23,105.35, seconded by Blakely. RCV: AYES: Baych, Barner, Kilburg, Blakely, Merritt. NAYS: None. **RESOLUTION 17-2022 adopted**.

Discussion held on Amnesty Day. Curbside pickup was discussed but felt the City would not be able to get enough volunteers to handle that task. They will look at holding them as a drop off service on June 18th if Wagaman can coordinate vendors.

Discussion held on charging a shut off fee for late water payers and no longer allowing the public works to take money. We currently only charge a turn on fee. Other communities charge a shut off fee at a designated time. Council was on board with this idea. Wagaman will write a policy and bring back to council for review.

Discussion was held on weekend funerals. Council did not feel a need to change the policy at this time. The City currently does not do burials on Sundays.

The next regular council meeting will be April 18, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall.

There being no further discussion, Blakely moved to adjourn at 7:07 p.m., seconded by Barner. All ayes. Motion carried.

Discussion held on selling the 2000 utility trailer. Council would like to sell by auction. Blakely made a motion to approve Resolution 18-2022 to set a public hearing for May 2, 2022, at 6pm to discuss the sale of real property, seconded by Barner. RCV: AYES: Kilburg, Blakely, Baych, Merritt, Barner. NAYS: None. RESOLUTION 18-2022 adopted.

Discussion held on the single bid for cemetery mowing. Barner made a motion to approve Resolution 19-2022 to award the cemetery mowing contract to Ellison Lawncare, seconded by Kilburg. RCV: AYES: Merritt, Kilburg, Blakely, Baych, Barner. NAYS: None. RESOLUTION 19-2022 adopted.

Sidewalk repair list was presented. Barner made a motion to approve the repairs by homeowners to be completed by September 1, 2022, seconded by Blakely. All ayes. Motion carried.

Discussion on purchase of a shed built by industrial tech class at SCSD. Council deferred this to Park Board.

The next regular council meeting will be May 2, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall.

There being no further discussion, Blakely moved to adjourn at 6:47 p.m., seconded by Barner. All ayes. Motion carried.
